Supporting Incarcerated Muslims Through Education

Overview

In Fall 2024, A Continuous Charity (ACC) distributed \$12,000 in Zakat funds to the Tayba Foundation. This sponsorship enabled 10 incarcerated Muslims to pursue structured Islamic education, covering tuition, books, and learning materials. The initiative empowered students to remain engaged in their studies while building leadership and resilience behind prison walls.

Why It Matters

Zakat is a divine trust meant to uplift the vulnerable. By directing Zakat to incarcerated Muslims, ACC relieved financial barriers and created opportunities for sacred knowledge. As the Qur'an reminds us: 'And establish prayer and give Zakat, and whatever good you put forward for yourselves – you will find it with Allah' (2:110).

In 2025, Tayba Foundation reported that all 10 students remained active in their studies. Several took leadership roles as mentors, Imams, and teachers in their facilities. The program fostered spiritual growth, discipline, and community building—extending beyond the sponsored students to positively influence others.
